Though about 25 men were at supper in the mess house about 40 feet distanct no one heard the report. After supper the men went to their rooms and the first to enter the room was Wm Storm who instantly gave the alarm. Friends were called and the doctor summoned but life was extinct. A messenger was at once sent to

Maple creek to notify Mrs Austin and family of the sad event and they left for Gardiner Toursday morning. Faneral services were held in Gardi-

ner Friday and the remains interred in the cemetery at that place. Joseph Austin was born in Shelby

county, Illinois, December 25th, 1857. At an early age he was married to Miss Cynthia Jones who survives him. To them nine children were born all of whom are living. In 1890 he came to Oregon and took

up a homestead on Maple creek, which was his home till the time of his death. Mr Austin enjoyed the respect and esteem of his neighbors. The sorrowing family have the heartfelt sympathy of
