The Benton county court has made arrangements to have a ferry operated at the Bundy crossing of the Long Tom in place of the bridge recently removed to accommodate steamboat navigation.

Judge W C Hale of Eugene has been unanimously recommended by the Oregon delegation in congress for appointment as district judge of Alaska. He was formerly judge of the first district of Oregon.
