Willie Brownlee, a 17 year old boy of Eugene, has been held in \$750 bonds on a charge of stealing \$225 from Geo F Oraw.

At Astoria last Friday Lake Moore was killed and Wm Beasley wounded by an insane man named Matt Hilstrom while they were trying to control him.

R Willard who was confined in the county jail at Salem awaiting trial on a charge of killing F D Perry, committed suicide by hanging, January 20th, 1900.

The schooner Del Norte, Captain Jacobson, two weeks out from San Francisco, arrived here Saturday and was towed up to Acme to load with lumber.

People residing near Point Terrace say that the high wind Monday night drove several hundred logs out around the upper end of the boom after which they floated down the river to the lower boom.

The body of August Fischer who disappeared from Eugene about four weeks previous, was found last Friday on the outside of Spencer Butte. He had been shot through the head by a bullet from his own rifle, but the coroner's jury were unable to decide whether it was accidental or intentional.

ORDINANCE NO 25.

An ordinance prohibiting the use of fire arms, air guns or spring guns within the corporate limits of the town of Florence.

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to use or discharge any firearm, air gun or spring gun within the limits of the town of Florence. Any person or persons convicted of the above offense before the Recorder's court shall be fined not less than \$5.00 and not to exceed \$50.00, or not less than three or more than twenty-five days imprisonment in the town jail. This ordinance to take effect and be in full force on and after it is approved by the president and the board of trustees and by publication in a newspaper published in the town of Florence, for ten days.

SAD ACCIDENT.

A 4 Year Old Boy Instantly Killed.

A Log Rolls on Him

Arthur Hartley of Maple Creek the Victim.

A terrible accident occurred about ten o'clock Sunday morning January 21st, 1900, at the home of Andrew Hartley on Maple creek, Douglas county about six miles southeast of Florence, by which Arthur, the four year old son of Mr Hartley, lost his life instantly.

The boy was playing around while his father was at work on a hillside sawing a log. Just as the saw cut through, the log climbed up on the log, when it started to roll throwing him to the ground below and passing over his head stopped across his breast. Mr Hartley dug away the earth and took the boy out from underneath the log as quickly as he could, but life was extinct, the weight of the log, some fifteen inches in diameter and twelve feet long, having caused instant death.
