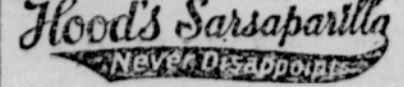

The influence of the administration is exerted in behalf of the Payne bill, now before the house ways and means committee, providing for an extension of the U S laws to Porto Rico, and the establishment of customs and internal revenue collection districts.

GENERAL NEWS.

M H De Young, publisher of the San Francisco Chronicle is mentioned as a candidate for the vice presidency.

The City of Peking arrived at San Francisco January 24th having on board the bodies of 150 of our soldiers who died in the Philippines.

On Thursday of last week the house of representatives passed a resolution declaring B H Roberts of Utah ought not to have a seat in congress and the seat to which he was elected is declared vacant.

Wm Goebel, democratic contestant for the office of governor of Kentucky was shot and dangerously wounded Tuesday morning.

Senator McBride's Indian war pension bill, favorably reported, extends the privileges of the pension system to the veterans of the Cayuse Indian war of 1847-48, and of the wars in Oregon and Washington from 1852 to 1856, as well as the surviving widows of such veterans.

Reports from General Buller say that General Warren's troops have retreated south of the Tugela river. The Boers say the British lost 1500 killed January 24th and that 150 of the English surrendered at Spionkop.

The schooner Danielson of San Francisco with 110,000 feet of lumber from the Florence Lumber Co's mill was towed out to sea Sunday morning.

The schooner Del Norte which arrived here last week, went to sea Sunday with a cargo of lumber from the Acme mill.

The schooner Bella, Captain Smith, was towed out over the bar Sunday bound for San Pedro with a cargo of 270,000 feet of lumber from the Acme mill.

The steamer Roberts left for Astoria Monday morning. She carried a load of canned salmon from the Elmore cannery at Gardiner and will bring W P Reed's new river steamer down to the Unququa.

The steamer Maggie left yesterday for Coos bay with 146 barrels of salt salmon belonging to Chas Saubert and Claude Yates on board.
