WASHINGTON LETTER.

FROM OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENT.

Washington, D. C., Mar 12, 1900. The senate did not take kindly to the proposal to pension ex-Queen Liliukalani, of Hawaii, and after some plain talk from a number of senators, the amendment to the diplomatic appropriaviding for the payment of \$20,000 to the ex-queen, and \$10,000 a year for the rest of her life was laid on the table. Several senators expressed willingness to vote for an appropriation of money to be given to the ex-queen as a gratuity but very decided opposition to pensioning her; but on the whole there was so much opposition that the amendment was tabled without a division. Senator president accepts his resignation from Tillman voiced the sentiment of many when he said that if this woman had any claim at all, which he doubted, it was upon the people of Hawaii, and not upon the U S.
