THE TERRITORY OF HAWAII.

S. F. Chronicle.

The unanimous agreement of the conference committee on the Hawaiian government bill may be assumed to have settled the question of the ultimate form of government of all our islands. The Hawaijan islands will be a territory of the United States, and the political status of their citizens will be in all essential respects like that of the people of Arizona. This disposes at once and forever of the contention that territories of the United States must be inhabited mainly by white races. Hawaii at the last census, contained 92,646 natives and Asiatics and 24,635 Caucasians, of whom 15,299 were Portuguese. nearly all of the contract labor class.
