## MACHINERY ARRIVED.

The Siuslaw & San Francisco Lumber Co Increasing Their Capacity.

The schooner Danielson which arrived here last Sunday brought in a large quantity of new machinery for the Siuslaw and San Francisco Lumber Co's mill at Acme.

There were two large boilers, an engine which are to be placed in the mill immediately and will increase the sawing capacity to 60,000 feet per day.

This means a demand for several million feet more of logs each year to keep this machinery running and will furnish employment for more men to cut the timber and get it to the mill.

The milling business of the Siuslaw is growing rapidly and is helping to build up the other industries.
