**DROWNING ACCIDENT.**  
Two Men Lose Their Lives on the Siuslaw River.  
A terrible drowning accident took place at the mouth of the Siuslaw river last Friday morning by which two sailors on the schooner Lizzie Prien were drowned. The following is an account of the catastrophe as related to us by Captain H. A. Hansen, master of the vessel.

The schooner was lying at anchor in the river and the two men accompanied by the captain, took a small boat and went out across the bar for the purpose of sounding to ascertain the depth of the water. They passed on to sea in safety and came back into the river again, the boat taking but very little water. After getting inside the bar they determined to sound across the channel and Captain Hansen gave up the steering and the two men went to manage the boat. A wave was seen approaching and the captain cautioned them to be careful but the wave broke over the boat filling it with water. The men were washed overboard but with some assistance from the captain, succeeded in getting back to the boat. Captain Hansen states that he helped one up on the boat twice and the other three times, but they became excited and unable to help themselves and soon drowned.

Captain Hansen clung to the boat which soon drifted into shallow water and he got ashore safely.  
One of the men lost was a Swede named Fred Hylander, and the other a German named Adolph Freundenthal. Both were young men, one being about 22 and the other about 26 years of age. Neither of them was married.

**THE CUNTY JUDGE-SHIP.**  
The suit between O F Knox and H R Kincaid for the office of county judge was tried before Judge Hamilton at Eugene last week.  
The result of the votes cast in five disputed precincts gave Knox the same number as the official count while Kincaid gained two votes. It was also stipulated between the parties that the ballots cast for O F Knox by Rev I G Knotts, who registered in Florence but voted in Eugene, and by I B Phillips of Cottage Grove, were illegal because they were not cast in precinct where the parties registered.  
This made the corrected vote stand Kincaid, 2,198; Knox, 2,193.  
On motion of W C Hale, attorney for Mr Knox, the contest and suit were then dismissed. Each party will be compelled to pay his own costs.
