INSANE MAN'S DEED.
Kills His Wife and Himself.
Herman Petersdorf, a German farmer
living about seven miles west of Junc-
tion, murdered his wife last Monday
night by beating her to death with a
club. He then went to a neighbor's and
asked for help to bury her. Two men
who went to the house found the body
of the woman lying in a fence corner some
rods from the house.
Word was sent to the sheriff at Eu-
gene who went to the scene with Con-
stable Miller and Justice Clark of Junc-
tion. They found Petersdorf on the
floor dead. It is supposed he took
poison.
An inquest was held by Coroner
Griffith and it was brought out that
Petersdorf gave as a reason for killing
the woman that his little girl had told
him that her mother had poisoned his
coffee and for him not to drink it. It
was also shown that he had been con-
sidered mentally unbalanced for two or
three years.
He was between 35 and 40 years old
and his woman about 35. Four little
ones whose ages range from 6 or 7 down
to 5 months are left orphans by the
terrible deed.
