ACCIDENTALLY KILLED.
David Galley, 362 Deane White Logging
at Glentena.
An accident occurred at Sutherland
& Galley's logging camp at Glentena on
Wednesday September 16th, by which
David Galley, a member of the firm
was almost instantly killed.
He and another man were sawing a
log on the hill side, Galley being on the
lower side. He had been warned sev-
eral times to let the other man finish
sawing, and only at the last minute did
he heed the warning, but it was too late
as the log gave way crushing him
against another log. He lived only
about 15 minutes after the accident.
The remains were taken to Eugene
where they were embalmed and shipped
to his home in Iowa.
Mr. Galley was highly respected by
his acquaintances; he was 27 years of
age and unmarried.
