PARIS LETTER. FROM OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENT.

Paris, France, September 17, 1900. The question of most political interest at the moment here is which of two feelings, not to say two interests, will influence the French government in its far eastern policy,-the alliance with Russia, or the oft-repeated promise of France to act in concert with the collective powers. With the mass of the people the first feeling is by far the stronger and in the end will probably prevail because, while the ministry strongly desires to keep its plighted word, at any rate to the world's ear, its fear of falling is stronger still and opportunism will therefore rule its councils. French ministers are of far too fragile a kind to risk knocking against the iron pot of popular sentiment when floating down the stream of politics, and particularly then, as in this case, the ministers, as men, heartily sympathize with popular predilection. TAKEN TO COURT

Injunction Served of Fish Traps in Siuelaw River

The dissatisfacaion of the fishermer with the use of fish traps has resulted in a suit being brought to compel the owners to remove them from the river.

A suit was filed last Friday with Clerk Lee enjoining the use of the traps perpetually. The case is entitled: John C Beck, James A McLeod, Wm. Brynd and W W Neely, plaintiffs Silk vs Wm. Kyle and M Meyer, co-partners under the firm name of Meyer & Kyle, Samuel Elmore, Frank Montgomery, George Montgomery and OW Hard.

L Bilyau and Thompson & Hardy are attorneys for plaintiffs. The following is a portion of the complaint:

"That said defendants and each of them are attempting unlawfully and wrongfully to prevent the plaintiffs herein and the persons whom the plaintiffs represent, from fishing in said Siuslaw river and its tributaries, and from following their occupations as such fishermen in the following manner,

That defendants have built and con structed and placed in said Siuslaw river, at divers points and places, and in said lower Sinsiaw bay, and in the tributaries of said Siuslaw river, particularly the North Forb, 'rge stationary fish traps.

That said defendants have unlawfully and wrongfully so placed said fish traps in said rivers as aforesaid, so as to entirely obstruct the channels of said streams rendering it impossible for plaintiffs and the persons whom the plaintiffs represent, to fish in said streams with drift nets and gill nets for the purpose of catching salmon and said defendants are now and for a long time bave been preventing the plaintiffs and the persons whom the the obstruction of said streams by said Seth Simmons failed to get his steam defendants as aforesaid, the plaintiffs and on said streams with gill nets and drift nets, in accordance with the laws of the


