NOTICE TO TAXPAYERS.

A SLIDE

A large slide took place at the government rock quarry at Point Terrace last Sunday evening. The rock had been removed leaving a high perpendicular wall on the side toward the hill. Back of this wall was a seam in the rock which extended in a slanting direction down to within a short distance of where the rock had been removed. There had been some heavy blasting being done for several days and this probably helped to loosen the earth and rock from above. A large mass slid in about eight o'clock Sunday evening and another early Monday morning. That part of the quarry was nearly filled and it was found necessary to move the machinery to the other part of the quarry which has not been used this season, to get rock to complete the present contract on the jetties.

It is fortunate that the slide happened when the men were not at work or it would probably have been attended with loss of life.

GENERAL NEWS.

A Manila dispatch of the 14th says: Captain Devereux Shields, who, with 51 men of Company F, Twenty-ninth Regiment, United States Volunteer Infantry, was captured by the insurgents last month in the Island of Marinduque was rescued yesterday by the American rescue force with all the members of his party.

Seventy-five million feet of standing pine, spruce, tamarack and cedar belonging to the state of Minnesota is to be sold to the highest bidder November 14. It is expected that the sale will bring the state \$250,000.

It is understood that the president has selected George Gray of Delaware to represent the United States with Ex-President Harrison on the Hague permanent arbitration tribunal. Judge Gray is an Ex-Senator and a democrat and is now United States district judge for the third judicial district.

Oregon Agriculturist: The Alday creamery paid \$900 more for butter fat in August this year than in August last year. In September of this year it will 18000 more than in September of last year. It is estimated that the total increase in payments over those of last year will amount to \$10,000.
