The new vessel, Alumna, was successfully launched at North Bend on Saturday afternoon. The launch went off about a hitch, and amid cheers from spectators, and salutes from the gun whistles, she glided gracefully to the water. The Alumna will be used as a fourmasted schooner, with a mast on the foremast. Her length of 101 1/2 feet, and her beam is 41 1/2 ft. She is to carry 1,200,000 feet of lumber, and will load at North Bend for south Africa direct. The Alumna is a little longer and has a little more beam than the full-rigged ship Western Shore, which was launched at North Bend on Oct. 10, 1874. The Western Shore was 1160 tons burthen; two decks, 8 feet between; length of keel, 180 feet; breadth of beam, 41 feet; depth of hold, 8 feet.—Coos Bay News.

SOLDIERS' FOUNTAIN. Guard, April 13.

Mayor G. R. Chrisman this afternoon held a conference with County Judge H. R. Kincaid and County Commissioner H. D. Edwards in regard to the location of the memorial fountain to be erected by the Women's Republican Patriotic league, in memory of the volunteers from Lane county, who gave their lives to their country in the recent war with Spain and in the Filipino insurrection.

It was decided to place the fountain at the southwest corner of the court house lot next to the sidewalk, and it is intended for a drinking place for man only.

The fountain is expected to arrive in about ten days and it will be erected immediately after its arrival. Appropriate ceremonies will be had at its dedication.
