PROTECTION AGAINST FIRE NEEDED.

The fire last Friday morning, by which \$20,000 worth of property was destroyed and the entire business portion of Florence put in jeopardy, has served to awaken the minds of our leading citizens to the need of more efficient apparatus for fighting the flames.

It has been suggested that a force pump to be worked by five or six men, be purchased by the town, together with several hundred feet of hose.

WASHINGTON LETTER.

(FROM OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENT.)

WASHINGTON, July 1, 1901.

The President's usual promptness in defining his position upon important matters is making his failure to either appoint a new commissioner of pensions, or to say that he intends to keep Commissioner Evans in that position, very puzzling to everybody.

Gen. Miles has an idea that it would be wise to withdraw the most of our troops from Cuba now, instead of waiting until the Cuban government is established, and he has officially recommended to Secretary Root that fifty per cent of the five thousand American troops now in Cuba, be ordered home, and the work they are doing be turned over to the Cubans.

In a large room of the Smithsonian Institution, a permanent exhibition will shortly be thrown open under the name of the "Children's Museum."

The additional claims against China, put in by Germany and several other powers, which were at first so puzzling to this government, are now known to have been prompted by a greed of which the powers should be heartily ashamed.

This government proposed that the excess should be deducted from the total indemnity to be paid by China, but from the manner with which the proposal was received, it is certain that it will not be accepted.

The receipts of the government for the fiscal year just closed exceeded its expenditures by \$76,000,000, which was about \$3,000,000 less than the surplus of the previous fiscal year.

GENERAL NEWS.

Civil government has been inaugurated in the Philippines, Commissioner Taft having been sworn in as governor July 4th.

The interior department has discovered extensive land frauds in the Northwest. It is said many arrests will soon be made.

A dispatch of July 6 from Manila says the insurgent leader Bellarmino, with 1000 men and 214 rifles, has surrendered to Col. Wint at Albay.

All gift enterprise guessing contest publications are hereafter to be excluded from the mails in the United States. The law will be strictly enforced.

Chas. G. Dawes, controller of the currency, has tendered his resignation to the president to take effect October 1. Mr. Dawes states it is his intention to be a candidate before the people of Illinois for the U. S. Senate, and he could not make the canvass and attend to the duties of his office satisfactorily at the same time.
