COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS.

A regular meeting of the town council was held in Old Fallows' building Monday evening with President Morris in the chair. Trustees Brynd, Christensen and Weatherson and the president answered at roll call. Absent, Trustee Evans.

Minutes of last meeting were read and approved. The following bills were allowed and warrants ordered drawn to pay for them: James Morris, services as deputy marshal July 4, \$3; George G. Peil, services as deputy marshal July 4, \$3; the West, printing, \$19. The bill of Bay & Co. Hotel for \$450 for board of prisoners was referred to finance committee.

The street committee reported an ordinance providing for building a sidewalk from the west side of Washington street near the Presbyterian church, along the north side of Second street to the west side of Madison street, thence across Second and thence on the north side of that street to the west side of Madison street, thence on the west side of Madison to the north side of Fourth street, terminating at the southeast corner of the Kobe property. The ordinance was read twice and will come up again at next meeting.

A petition signed by some twenty of the heaviest taxpayers in town was presented asking the council to levy a tax to provide adequate protection for property against fire. On motion the president was directed to ascertain the cost of a suitable hand pump and hose and report to the council at the next meeting. Adjourned.

THE STRIKE. Late reports from San Francisco say the outlook for an amicable settlement of the strike has considerably diminished and indications are that the contest will be a protracted one. Mayor Phelan has been compelled to abandon his position as mediator. The sand teamsters, about 600 in number, were ordered out Monday night. This will leave about 5000 carpenters and builders without material to continue their work. The bakers and electrical workers have been ordered to hold themselves in readiness to quit work at a moment's notice.

Ship owners and masters of vessels telegraphed to the secretary of the treasury at Washington asking that Chinese employed on vessels be permitted to unload vessels. The secretary refused to allow them to go on the wharves, as that would be a violation of the Chinese exclusion act.
