MAY RECEIVE BOUNTY.

It is now claimed in certain circles that there is an old federal law by which the volunteers who saw service in the late Spanish-American war are each entitled to a bounty of \$192.

A recent issue of the Cincinnati Enquirer contains the following dispatch from New York:

"It has been discovered by a lawyer of Brooklyn that every volunteer who enlisted in the Spanish-American war is entitled to bounties amounting to \$276 provided by a federal and state statute passed many years ago."

It will be seen that the \$84 referred to in the above paragraph is the sum of the bounty paid by the state of New York. Should there be any truth in the claim that the volunteers of the late war will receive a bounty of \$192 each, it is estimated that the payment of the claims will cost the federal government \$5,000,000.

WASHINGTON LETTER.

(FROM OUR REGULAR CORRESPONDENT.)

WASHINGTON, Oct. 7, 1901.

The modest little Dutch Reform Church chosen by President Roosevelt as his place of worship is to profit largely by his preference. The members of his denomination throughout the union are raising a fund of \$50,000 with which to erect a more commodious and stately church on the ground now so humbly occupied.

The independence which characterizes President Roosevelt seems also to obtain in his family. Mrs. Roosevelt is a loyal communicant of the Protestant Episcopal Church, and has been granted possession of the famous "Presidential pew" in historic old St. John's church, on Lafayette Square.

A strong movement is being inaugurated in this city and is to be extended throughout the country, to the end of having the projected bridge across the Potomac, converted into a magnificent McKinley Memorial bridge.

The remarkable manifestations of personal affection and regret made throughout the South, upon the occasion of President McKinley's assassination and death, have emphasized, in the public appreciation, his patriotic efforts to stamp out sectionalism and to make the Southern people feel themselves real and equal co-partners in the nation's government and glory.

Secretary Gage is quoted in dispatches from Colorado, where he is visiting, as predicting the retirement from the Cabinet at an early date, of Secretary of State Hay. Such an event would not be surprising. The Secretary is in hearty accord with the proclaimed policy of President Roosevelt, undoubtedly, but both his health and his personal inclinations impel him to forego further official cares.
