

that there is an old federal law by which the volunteers who saw service in the late Spanish-American war are each entitled to a bounty of \$192. It is said the law was enacted shortly after the civil war and never repealed. This is a matter of considerable interest to the boys who went to the Philippines, and if it proves true will be the means of bringing a good many thousand dollars to Lane county and some of it to the Siuslaw valley.

A recent issue of the Cincinnati Enquirer contains the following dispatch from New York :

"It has been discovered by a lawyer of Brooklyn that every volunteer who enlisted in the Spanish-American war is entitled to bounties amounting to \$276 provided by a federal and state statute passed many years ago. The state bou nty law provides for the payment of \$84 and the federal law \$192 to each volunteer."

It will bee seen that the \$84 referred to in the above paragraph is the sum of the bounty paid by the state of New York. Should there be any truth in the claim that the volunteers of the late war will receive a bounty of \$192 each, it is estimated that the payment of the claims will cost the federal government \$5,000,000. 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


