

PERSECUTION OF THE JEWS.

The following are the principal heads of the infamous bill recently presented to the Roumanian Chamber to regulate the position of Jews in that country...

I. No Jews shall fix themselves in any urban district without the consent of the municipal council.

II. Jews guilty of having offended against the preceding article shall be treated as vagabonds.

III. Jews shall not be permitted to hold rural or urban freehold property. The purchase or sale of real property by a Jew is null and void.

IV. Any person having lent his aid to the violation of the above mentioned articles shall lose his political rights for a period of not less than three years.

V. No Jew shall hold or rent land, vine shops, distilleries, vineyards, bridges, sheep runs, cattle stalls, or hotels on the high road.

VI. The authorities are forbidden to accept any request emanating from a Jew for permission to associate himself with others in such a manner as may in any degree contravene the terms of article V.

VII. Before a Jew shall be permitted to undertake any business of commerce, he shall obtain from the local authorities a special permission.

VIII. Any business, the object of which is providing directly or indirectly food and drink for Christians, is wholly forbidden to Jews.
