ATTEMPT TO RELEASE PRISONER

—SHOOTING—CULPRIT ESCAPES—

On Wednesday last Sheriff Smith made an examination of the apartment occupied by the prisoner Charles Sutton, confined in the Dallas jail on the charge of breaking into the store of Messrs. Vanduy & Sommerville some time since. Concealed in the prisoner's bed the Sheriff found two monkey wrenches, three case knives, two hand saw files and other implements which are supposed to be useful in such contingencies. This circumstance led the Sheriff to suspect that something might be learned by watching. Accordingly when night came on, that officer, accompanied by Mr. J. D. Riggs, took a position inside the court yard fence and commanding a view of the jail and its approaches, there determined to await developments. A little after midnight, a low, heavy set man, dressed in a dark suit, walked boldly up to the jail and stopped under the window of the prisoner's cell and broke a stick to attract his attention. Failing thus to arouse his man, he threw a pebble against his window which promptly brought "Dinah in her night clothes." A conference followed, which terminates by the stranger departing under promise to be "back in a night or two." He is hailed by Mr. Riggs who emerges from his hiding place and orders him to halt! at his peril—deliberately turns about, faces his assailant and fires—Mr. R. fires also. The Sheriff fires about this time. Several shots were exchanged, all hands taking part—nobody hurt—the stranger escapes.

A Polk County Invention. J. M.
