Grasshoppers in California.

There are myriads of grasshoppers on the Norris grant, just across the American river from this city. On the dry plains and cultivated tracts of that vast domain they swarm in countless thousands.

The Galt Gazette of last Saturday says: "The grasshoppers are playing havoc to an alarming extent over the country surrounding Clay Station, especially north and east of that point."

There is no use denying that the grasshopper situation is becoming alarming. They are appearing in vast numbers all over the State, and it is a well-known fact that their ravages are always worst after a dry season.

The Calaveras Chronicle of last Saturday says: "Grasshoppers are very plentiful in the vicinity of Valley spring, in this county. We have been informed by the farmers living in that section that the ground is littered black with them, and unless some means are provided for their destruction, they will undoubtedly destroy the entire crops in that vicinity."

Stockton, May 11.—George S. Waterman, who lives between Farmington and Trigo, in this county, states that the advance guard of grasshoppers which have been feeding on the growing grain in Butte county and elsewhere has arrived. The only wheat which survive the onslaught will be the summer-fallowed grain.

The Marysville Democrat says: C. E. Shelton has informed us that out in his section of the county, Yuba Dam, the festive hopper was getting in his work with a vengeance. Amos Lane has lost about twenty-five acres of wheat by them, eaten off close to the ground, and others are threatened.

Oroville Mercury: The grasshoppers are eating the foliage from orange, peach and apple trees about Wyandotte, and also destroying the vegetables in the gardens. A correspondent of the Red Bluff People's Cause writes from Lowry's under date of May 1st, as follows: For the benefit of those

having orchards threatened with a grasshopper visitation please allow me to relate my last year's experience in that line. I have a small orchard with Alfalfa on three sides of it. The green alfalfa drew the hoppers from all sides to the one point, the orchard. Of course that was the next thing in order after the alfalfa was finished, and they attacked it in full force.
