Produce Park.

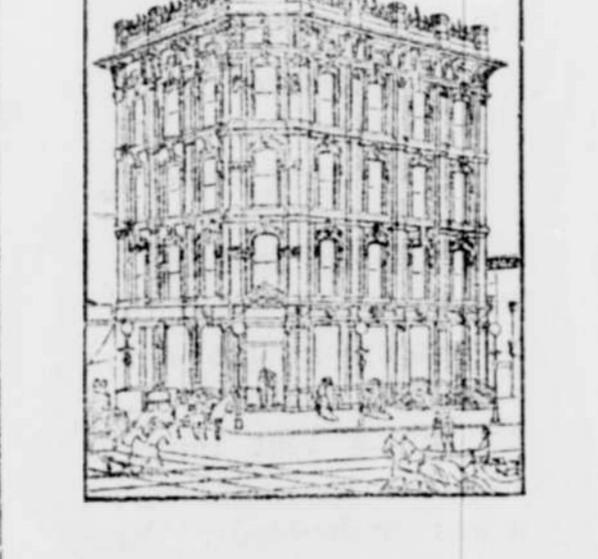

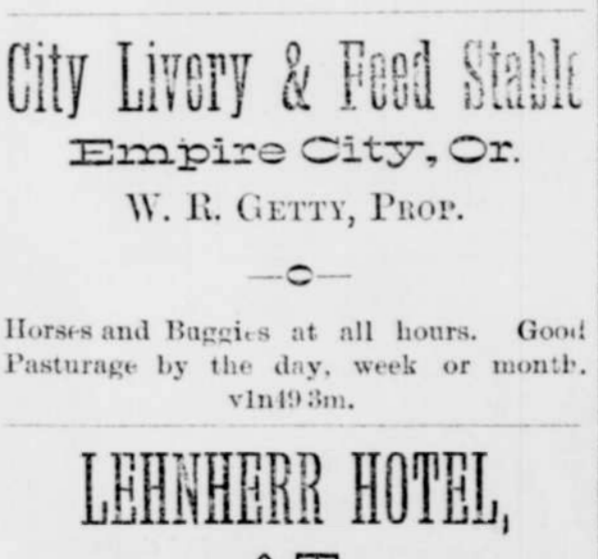
