Good prospects for a rail road before long, as the R. R. company, has had men here getting statistics, and sketches of the country.

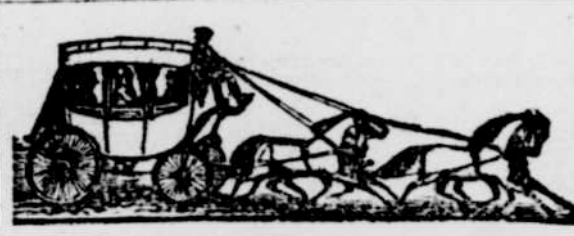
