A Total Abstinence Town. All the saloons in Tulare, California, were closed on the 7th. The controversy rests as much upon the restrictions imposed as on the \$400 a year license. The ordinance requires the applicant to be of good moral character, furnish a bond of \$100,000, allow no gambling, card-playing or music, and not sell to minors or common drunkards.
