A meeting was held in Marshfield a few nights ago to consider a proposition to establish a woollen mill at that place. There was a good attendance of citizens and much enthusiasm. Mr. Shaw of Oregon City made the proposition for a subsidy of one acre of land with water-front, water enough to fill a 2-inch pipe, constant the mill building of an agreed size and donate \$5000 in cash. A committee comprising J. W. Bennett, Dr. C. W. Tower and H. Sengstacken was appointed to investigate the proposition and report at a later meeting.

Council Proceedings.

The city board met at city hall Monday morning at 9 o'clock, in regular quarterly session. Present: John Goodman, chairman; Aldermen G. A. Brown, Walter Drane, S. W. Harrington and W. S. Perry; City Recorder Myers; City Marshal Johnson. Minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

The report of City Treasurer S. L. Leneve was read and filed. The summary is as follows, up to Oct. 1, 1894:

Bal. in fund.....\$ 39.27 A petition was presented from citizens on Front, Main and First streets, agreeing to furnish street lamps, one to be placed at Odd Fellow's hall corner, one at northeast corner of Front and C streets, and one by Mr. Nasburg individually at corner of Front and B streets, provided the city would furnish the oil or gasoline for the same.

On motion, it was ordered that an ordinance be drafted providing for the purchase of oil or gasoline for street lights. To settle the matter of who shall make street repairs, it was moved that the expense of repairs on the streets (except sidewalks), after being put to grade, planked or paved, and received by the board, shall be met by the city, while property-owners will be required to keep up the sidewalks. Carried. Moved and carried that J. S. Kanematz be appointed city surveyor Mr. K. qualified.

Moved and carried that the city surveyor be instructed to make an accurate map of Coquille City for the city's use. On motion a quarter's salary was ordered for the city marshal. On motion the chairman was ordered to instruct the marshal to close up all drains that contaminate any of the streams of water that are used for drinking purposes in the city. Adjourned till 2 p. m.

AFTERNOON SESSION. The recorder read an ordinance regulating bicycle and tricycle riding within the corporation. Certain amendments were ordered inserted and the ordinance to be reported at another meeting. The marshal was instructed to provide some new bedding for the city jail. Council then proceeded to codify the city ordinances for publication. Ordinance No. 1, an ordinance to regulate the liquor traffic within the corporate limits, was made to conform to the general law and passed. It provides that an application for licence must be made by publication of notice at least five days before the meeting of the board; the application must be accompanied by a bond of not less than \$1000; no license will be issued for less than three months. Adopted—Yess, Harrington, Drane, Brown, Perry. Nays—none; absent—none.

NIGHT SESSION. Ordinance No. 22, to regulate the running of bicycles and tricycles within the corporate limits, provides that those vehicles shall not be run on sidewalks in those parts of town where the streets are planked; that the owner must provide a bell or other appliance to give warning to pedestrians; on approaching pedestrians, or street corners, the rider must slow up and give warning with bell; pedestrians shall take inside of walk and bicycle the outside, and in case the pedestrian does not yield the right-of-way, the bicyclist shall not run the pedestrian down; in case a wrong occupies the sidewalk, as when people are going to or returning from school or church, bicyclist must give the sidewalk and not ride through the throng. Violation of this ordinance imposes a fine of not less than \$5 nor more than \$20, or imprisonment in city jail not less than one day for each \$2 of fine imposed. Adjourned to Thursday, 2 p. m.
