Beaver Hill Coal Company. A San Francisco dispatch, dated March 26th, says: "A few days ago articles of incorporation of the Beaver Hill Coal Company were filed, the directors of the new company, being A. B. and J. D. Spreckels, F. S. Samuels, Charles A. Hug and R. A. Graham. Messrs. Samuels and Hug are both associated with the Spreckels in the shipping business conducted by the latter, as well as in other enterprises. The capital stock of the new corporation is fixed at \$500,000, and the coal mine which its members propose to work is located on the Coquille. J. D. Spreckels said: "Our mine is located immediately adjoining that of Goodall, Perkins & Co., near Coos bay. As yet we have put none of the product on the market here, but we have been quietly at work developing the mine and getting ready for business. Our preparations are now practically complete. When I say that we have put none of the coal on the market here, I do not mean to indicate that it has not been tested by actual use. On the contrary, this has been thoroughly done, the results proving that we have an excellent quality of coal. More than that, I am able to state, in view of the investigations we have made, that we will have plenty of it. We will have it on the market here in about two weeks. I may say, too, by the way, that we have disposed of a couple of hundred tons of the coal right there at the mine."

The steamer Homer has already been chartered to run between this port and Coos bay.
