You killed your friend without any intention of committing that crime; of that I am satisfied. You were crazed by drink and renwhat you did. It was done under the influence of rum, which causes 75 per cent of the crimes committed in this country.





Such legislation is seldom retroactive. Therefore it is of great importance that applications be filed in the department at the earliest possible date.

If U. S. soldiers, sailors or their widows, children or parents, desire information in regard to pension matters, they should write to The Press Claims Company, at Washington, D.
