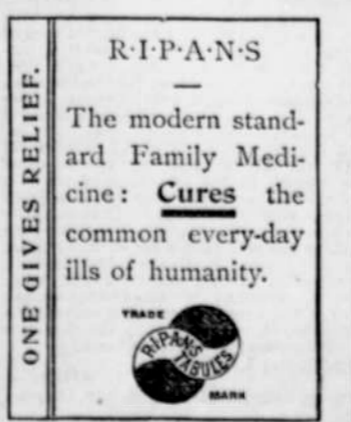

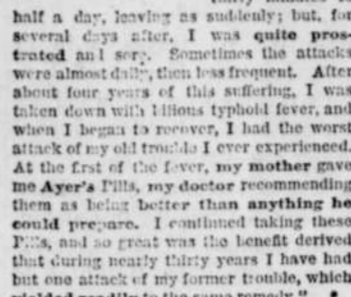

Such legislation is seldom retroactive. Therefore it is of great importance that the application be filed in the department as early as possible.
