

THE LABOR EXCHANGE.

The Labor Exchange is purely a social organization, non-religious and non-political, and does not antagonize any industry, institution or person; it does not propose to do away with money entirely, but intends to make it possible to do business, when, like at present, we have none, or at least not enough to do business with. It makes labor the standard of value instead of gold; makes over-production impossible by increasing consumption, for then men can by their labor obtain any and all of the necessities and luxuries of life who otherwise would do without them. Our farmers on this coast raise more fruit, vegetables and stock than they can use or find a cash market for, and factories all over the county are shutting down because they cannot find a cash market for clothing and necessities. There are millions of people in a starving condition and without enough clothing to keep them warm, because they have not got the legal tender money with which to purchase the things which are necessary to comfort and good-living. If these could barter their labor direct for these things they would work more and consume more, and thus give an extra impetus to increase the future out-put of all branches of labor, which will be paid for in labor checks which command your confidence, for, unlike gold, it always has back of it some useful product of labor—will always procure something to eat, wear or enjoy, and gold can do no more.

We clip the following from "Sound Money," of Massillon, Ohio: "The progress of the L. E. is moving in Ohio. Since our branch, No. 84, was organized last fall, branches 86, 109, 111 and 117 have been organized in this section. No. 84, at Ash-tabula, is taking the lead. We are organizing departments of industry as fast as we get to them. We are now manufacturing brooms, baskets, ironing tables; taking contracts for building and employing our mechanical members; also building cement works, and have a few acres of land donated."

The branch, or association, which is the entire membership, own their different branches of industry collectively; the laborers and depositors get value received for all they put in, and the institution gets the profit which the factory, wholesale houses and jobbers do now. This profit belongs to all the members, to be distributed as follows: For repairs and new industries; for the employment of idle labor; to care for the sick and aged; to add to the stock in trade; to establish schools, libraries, places of amusement, parks, public roads, etc., in all of which each member has an equal interest. After he has received full value for service rendered, he has still an interest in what is created, while under the old plan all goes to the capitalist, who performs no labor on the same.

The first and greatest evil the L. E. will abolish is debt, thereby stopping interest, mortgages and their attendant evils. By establishing a depot of exchange, any member can take anything of use or value and get a check to the value of said article, which will circulate as money, making it possible for anyone willing to work to pay as they come and go, thereby saving to themselves the extra 20 per cent which all credit firms have to add to wake up for the losses in book accounts.

Next week we promise some very interesting details of the modus operandi of the depository and the function proper of the checks.
