TEN SENSIBLE FARMERS.

Necessity Became the Mother of Invention and Released the Bondmen.

One evening in the month of February sometime prior to the beginning of the 20th century, nine farmers received a copy each of the following letter written by a brother farmer well known to them all:

"DEAR SIR AND FRIEND: The subject which I am about to introduce to you is one of much importance to myself and if rightly considered may prove to be of equal importance to you. I have 160 acres of good farm land worth, as land sells in this region, at least \$5000. The Tyenup Loan & Investment Co. holds a mortgage upon the place of \$1000 and this mortgage is now due and about to be foreclosed. To pay off the indebtedness with interest and costs I need \$1125 and am not able to raise half that sum even though I sacrifice all my personal property. In this crisis I have been doing some hard thinking. I have also sought light upon the subject by reading some little works on finance. Finally I have resolved to make a proposition to a few of my neighbors, including yourself. What I have to propose may not strike you favorably at first, but reflection will show you that the plan is for the best interests of us all.

"I wish to form an organization to resene, own, cultivate and improve this farm which is about to fall into the clutches of Tyenup, Loan & Investment Co. I will accept \$3675 in deposit certificates for my remaining interest in the farm, thus putting in the land at a valuation of \$30 per acre. These deposit certificates will be made redeemable in products of the farm, and when redeemed in corn, wheat, hogs, poultry, butter, eggs, potatoes, beans, hay, sorghum, onions, etc., etc., as members of the organization will own the farm and our deed will be on record to attest the fact. I am willing to stay upon and manage this farm, and you, if you accept my proposition, can remain upon your own farm endeavoring to pay off your mortgage by the old plan if you wish; but while so doing you can have the satisfaction of knowing that if you fail you will still have a share in a farm that is not mortgaged, a farm that is capable of supporting 30 families or more and that may be depended upon for a home should you lose your present one. Come and see me tomorrow night and we will talk the matter over.

Each of the nine farmers thus appealed to by Mr. White read the letter carefully and laid it aside for further consideration.

We do not anticipate that there will be any radical changes in the administration of pension affairs under the new regime. We would advise, however, that U. S. soldiers, sailors, and their heirs, take steps to make application at once. If they have not already done so, in order to secure the benefit of the early filing of their claims in case there should be any future pension legislation. Such legislation is seldom retroactive. Therefore it is of great importance that applications be filed in the department at the earliest possible date.

If U. S. soldiers, sailors or their widows, children or parents, desire information in regard to pension matters, they should write to THE PENSION CLAIMS COMMISSION, at Washington, D.
