

THE LABOR EXCHANGE. TEN SENSIBLE FARMERS.

Necessity Became the Mother of Invention and Released the Bondmen.

PART SECOND.

Not all were favorably impressed but every one was sufficiently interested to accept his neighbor's invitation to call and have a talk upon the subject.

"I can't raise the money," said one.

"I have other uses for all the money I can get," said another.

"I don't see what good it will do us to pay off your debt," said a third.

"If you don't mean to pay interest, what are we to get out of our investment?" inquired a fourth.

But Henry White knew his men and had picked them carefully. "You can raise the money if you want to, Tom Grey," said he; "just turn your cattle over to me and I'll raise \$125 out of them. Yes, George Harris, I know you have other uses for your money; you work night and day for the Tyemop Loan Co. the same as I've been doing, and you will soon have to lose your farm and all your hard work just as I'll lose my farm and work unless you men help me out. Better put a few dollars aside now where they will be safe. It may do your family some good, Dick Buell, if you help pay off my debt, because if you should die they will have a partnership in a good farm that will afford them a home which they may not have if you depend upon getting that place of yours clear of mortgage.

"As for interest on the investment, I'd like to know, John Turner, how much interest you get on the investment you make with the Tyemop every year? If you could get the principal back you would be happy. Now I want you to invest \$125 where it will keep and, more than that, where it will double itself. The \$125 deposit certificates issued to you for the money will be redeemable in farm produce. You can draw this produce for the certificates and eat it, or trade it, or sell it for money to pay to the Tyemop and you will still be a member of the organization to which the farm is deeded. The stubs from which your deposit certificates are clipped will show that you have \$125 proportional interest in the farm."

Farmer White was armed at all points and met every opposing argument with convincing replies. Moreover his enthusiasm was so great and he was so determined to save his farm from the grasp of Tyemop that his brother farmers caught his spirit and the cause was won. A Labor Exchange branch was organized and chartered. The \$1125 were raised. The mortgage was lifted and the new L. E. branch received the deed of a farm.

Henry White as business manager now proceeded to carry on farming operations upon a different plan from that which usually prevails in agricultural districts. His object now was not to raise money to pay to the Loan and Investment Co., but to raise food and erect shelter for human beings. Finding a number of idle men in the village near by, he induced them to go to work upon the farm for L. E. checks redeemable in produce. Finding some farmers with a superabundance of horses he induced them to put two or three good teams into the Exchange for deposit checks. Finding his neighbors with more wheat, potatoes, pork, hay and corn than they expected to use for a few months he persuaded them to put some of these supplies on deposit for checks, and this food was provided for the men and teams.
