

THE LABOR EXCHANGE.

Let us compare the Labor Exchange depository with the ordinary one-horse banks. They are one-horse because they deal only in money and confidence, and the Labor Exchange is complete because it includes every product and every necessary business besides money and confidence too.

Many people have things about them that they do not use which would be very handy and useful to some one else. Hence, by depositing those surplus articles they will get checks which will be convenient to make exchange or to buy with and to pay for labor for the creation of more wealth.

If you have money, put it in the Exchange and it will be used to buy machinery and raw material to employ idle labor and create the manufactured goods which you draw as you need it, in such form as you may desire, with the checks.

This plan is not only a much safer way of banking, but it gives the idle an opportunity to create more wealth and creates a demand for the surplus of others. The effect will be to make a rapid growth of prosperity instead of a steady downward tendency.

To Start a Branch.

- 1st—Secure room for depository, in a business place if possible. 2d—Let each member place on deposit some article of use. 3d—If you cannot get legal tender for labor take "trade," even if it be something you may not need for yourself at present.

The laboring people produce all wealth, but the idle drones are getting the most of it. The Labor Exchange is an easy and peaceful method to remedy this and change the earth into a paradise.

Our way of issuing money is not on wind as is the custom of the national bankers, but the Labor Exchange only issues on real values of products on deposit and in the keeping of the branch that makes the issue.

It is not in reality money that is the root of all evil, but the use to which it is put. If money was properly issued and used in the right way there is almost no end to the good it would do.
