Typesetting Machines.

To Be Abolished in the Kansas State Printing Office.

Topeka, Kans., June 28.—J. S. Parks, state printer-elect, announced today that the use of typesetting machines would be abolished in the state printing office with the beginning of his administration.

The law provides that the state printer shall receive but 10 cents a thousand ems for machine work. It is claimed that, at this rate, the machines cannot be operated except at a loss and as a result they will be thrown out and the state will pay from 30 to 45 cents per thousand for hand composition.

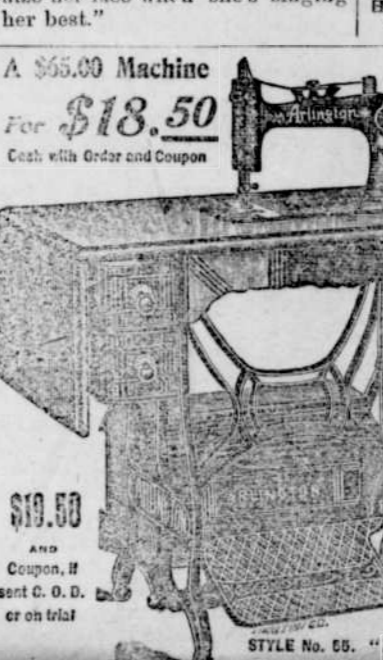
