Canadian Pacific Tools.

The Oregonian editorially refers to Sec. 22 of the Dingley tariff law, which McKimley's attorney general declared operative and void, in the following drastic manner:

"The loss to our lines (railroads) by the bonding privilege alone which Sec. 22 of Dingley act abrogated is estimated at \$25,000,000 a year yet no move is made in congress to remedy this injustice."

Then referring to the present railroad war of rates and consequent confusion in commercial circles resulting from unstable freight rates, the great Republican paper scolds equal to a Populist. It says:

"These are abominations almost unbearable and we shall never see the last of them as long as congress and the department of justice sit in dumb compliance with the Canadian Pacific." This indicts the republican administration and congress of being tools of the English corporation, and looks like the indictment is true.—La Grande Observer.
