POUL MURDER AND SUICIDE.

One Robert Tuttle Killed Miss Annie Kelly and Then Shot Himself.

The usually quiet and pleasant neighborhood of Libby, near Marshfield, in this county, was the scene of a horrible and sad tragedy last Wednesday afternoon about 2 o'clock. The brief news came to this place by telephone a short while after the event and while Coroner Dr. Horsfall was preparing to hold an inquest and evolve the facts, which, to that hour were somewhat of a mystery as to the cause.

The fearful crime occurred at the home of a widow lady named Mrs. Kelly, with whom the author and finisher of the bloody crime, one Robert Tuttle, aged about 30 years, boarded, and whose family included a son, John Kelly, and the daughter, Annie Kelly, the victim of the foul deed, aged about 17 years. The family and boarders had partaken of dinner, but Tuttle did not go to work in the mine, a little later retiring to his room. Miss Annie went up stairs to attend to some household duties, the brother being below stairs, and the mother out of a few steps from the house for water or wood, and on turning to go to the house she heard two rifle shots within the house, one close after the other. The son mounted the stairway and was struck by Tuttle and knocked down a deep gash on the head and several teeth knocked out. Tuttle followed young Kelly down and tried to shoot him, failing in which he turned the gun on himself, blowing most of his head off.

No cause was down or revealed for the act. The jury which investigated the case made the following returns: In the case of Miss Annie Kelly: Libby, Oregon, July 6th, 1898.—We, the jury, found that Annie Kelly came to her death from a gunshot wound; said gun in the hands of Robert Tuttle, and said shots were fired by one Robert Tuttle. (Signed) W. M. Richardson, Alex Campbell, J. W. Findell, John M. Smith, John Pearson, Wm. Escott.

And in the case of Tuttle himself: We, the jury, find that Robert Tuttle came to his death from a gunshot wound; said gun in the hands of Robert Tuttle, and said shots were fired by one Robert Tuttle himself. (Signed same as above.)
