G. Brown, representing the state land office, arrived in town yesterday on their way to North slough and Tenmile, to inspect and report on the swamp land of that section. The steamer Noyo left Port Angeles, Wash., on June 23d, for Yukon, with three river steamers in tow. One of the boats, the Alfred J. Beach, was in charge of Capt. Frank Etrod, of Marshfield, and R. M. Palmer, late of this place, was mate. Superintendent Hennessey's horse ran away, Sunday, near Newport. Mr. Hennessey was alone in the buggy at the time, and in turning a sharp corner was thrown out. The horse continued to run, smashing the buggy to pieces, and ended by charging a barb-wire fence.
