J. B. Fox has been awarded two bridges to build by the county court, both on the Coquille-Marshfield road. Lumber was shipped last Wednesday to the bridge at Hanscom's, and Mr. Fox and helpers went down Thursday morning to begin work.

E. P. Mast was down from McKinley last Wednesday. He informs us that their wheat crop, so promising a short while ago, has been damaged from a quarter to one-half by a little spotted fly—a stranger to them—about 1/4 of an inch long. There is a green aphid, also, by the millions, in such quantity that he never saw the like. These, however, he says, are not injuring the grain, nor does he know if they are destroying the fly mentioned above. No other grain except the wheat seems to be effected by the fly.

Orsognian, July 14th: In the suit of Thomas E. Ryan against the California Lumber company, to recover \$43,345 and \$173 costs on notes, Judge Sears yesterday confirmed the sale of several thousand acres of land in Coos county to satisfy the judgment by the sheriff of that county. In another suit by Ryan against the same company in which judgment for \$10,561 was obtained, the sale by the sheriff of Coos county of mill appliances, such as chains, lumber trucks, scows, belting, blocks, etc., located in Coos county, and about 260 acres of land, was also confirmed.

Portland Telegram, 16th inst: J. Quick, an old settler of Coos county, is in this city, on his way to the national G. A. R. encampment, which takes place at Cincinnati in September this year. Mr. Quick served two enlistments in the civil war as cavalryman and immediately after the war ended settled on the placid Coquille. He says there is a big crop of hay in Coos county this year, but he fears there will be no means of shipping it to San Francisco, where it is badly needed. He is another citizen of Coos who thinks Portland might cultivate closer commercial relations with Coos and Curry counties and profit very much thereby.

Few people have any idea of the relative areas of the Philippine and Hawaiian islands. The Philippines include about 1200 islands, less than half of which are inhabitable and only 10 or 12 are of any considerable size. Their combined area is about 135,000 square miles, or more than one-third times the area of the state of Oregon. The population is said to exceed 10,000,000 of which but 10,000 (outside the army) are pure Spanish. Manila, the Capital and principal city, has a population of 250,000 at the present time. The Hawaiian islands are only fifteen in number, of which only eight are inhabited. Their total area is less than 7000 square miles. The total population is 110,000, and that of Honolulu, the capital and chief city, less than 30,000. The Americans on the islands number but 3000.
