In the late appropriation of the state school fund, Coos county is accredited with 3829 children of school age, and gets \$4594.80. Curry county has 744 children and receives \$892.80. The per capita is \$1.20, against \$1.04 last year, and the total fund—interest on the irreducible school fund—is \$165,403.60, and is \$21,749.36 in excess of the distribution of 1897.

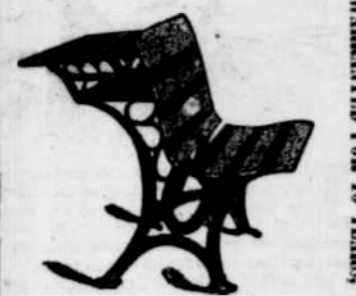

Mr. Johnson is therefore a minister of that denomination. Mr. Hume, who is the owner and promoter of the place and conducts large canning and mercantile interests there, recently wrote to the authorities of the Presbyterian church at Portland stating that he would erect a church and parsonage and contribute \$600 towards the same. As a reply, Mr. Johnson was recommended for the new field of labor and has been accepted.

San Francisco, Aug. 8.—Ex-Mayor Adolph Sutro died at 2:30 o'clock this morning. Sutro was born in 1830 at Aix-la-Chapelle, Prussia. He came to San Francisco in 1850 and engaged in mercantile pursuits. Later he turned his attention to mining. He became the largest individual property-owner in San Francisco, and it is estimated that he leaves an estate of \$4,000,000. He was elected mayor four years ago, and served one term.

J. B. Montgomery, a capitalist and veteran Republican of Oregon, having just returned from a business trip through the eastern states, in an interview in the Spokesman-Review, giving some very interesting reading for the prosperity howlers who attribute every blessing to the Republican party. He reports business in the extreme eastern states as rotten. He says that even New York City is like a grave yard, that Philadelphia is no better. He reports that through the south the planters went behind on their cotton crop, and stagnation is the result. He reports business in the middle western states where wheat is the crop, as fairly good with dismal prospects for this year's price. He declares that if any man says there is a revival of business in the east, he is a liar. Dun and Bradstreet reports show that the business failures of the United States were greater for the year ending on the 1st inst. than they were for the year ending 1893, the great panic year. This is a fearful showing when we take into consideration our immense wheat crop in connection with the good price of other cereals in sympathy with it. With these immense crops, our big export trade, our Republican tariff, the advance agent of prosperity seated in the White House, and Marcus Aurelius Hanna at the helm, the gold standard cuckooing sing periodically of Republican prosperity.
