Port Orford Tribune: In the injunction suit in the case of R. D. Hume vs. Turner, Strahan et al., in which plaintiff set up a claim to both sides and bottom of Rogue River, and the exclusive right to fish in the waters of Rogue River, asking for a perpetual injunction forbidding restraining defendants from fishing in said river, the claims set up by plaintiff virtually received a very black eye. The temporary injunction granted by Judge Riley, restraining defendants from fishing, was so modified as to permit them to fish so long as they do not trespass on the lands of plaintiff, and do not obstruct the river against the free passage of fish. Thus Hume's claim to exclusive fishing privileges is denied by the court. J. M. Upton was appointed referee to take testimony, and the case continued until next term. The Strahan boys will continue to engage in fishing extensively.

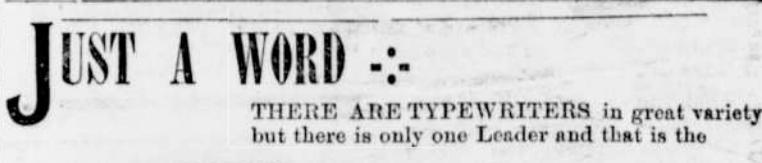
