A FATAL CUTTING SCRAPE.

At a Debating Society, Near Fairview, Two Youths Quarrel.

At the North Fork school, known best as the Moon district, near Fairview, last Saturday night, a fatal cutting scrape was enacted between two youths of the neighborhood, resulting in the almost instant death of one and placing the brand of a criminal on the other.

The school is the one presided over by our charming young schoolmaster, Miss Irma Lukens, and the affair was between pupils of the school and youth of the neighborhood. The one who was killed was Roy Hollebeck, aged about 17 years, and the stabbing was done by Gay Beckwith, aged 18 years.

Sheriff Gage was telephoned for and Deputy Clyde Gage went out early Sunday morning. Dr. Callin went out, also, as deputy coroner.

Deputy Gage returned Sunday evening with the prisoner, young Beckwith, and placed him in jail. He appeared before Justice Cecil Monday morning about 11 o'clock for arraignment, and the case was set for a hearing at 1 p. m. today.
