General Garcia, the Cuban Patriot, Dead.

Washington, Dec. 12.—General Calixto Garcia, the distinguished Cuban warrior and leader, and the head of the commission elected by the Cuban assembly to visit this country, died here yesterday morning shortly after 10 o'clock at the Hotel Raleigh, where the commission has its headquarters.

Washington, Dec. 12.—The Dolphin will be designated by the navy as the vessel to carry the remains of Garcia to Cuba. She is now lying at the Washington navy yard.

Oregon Dead at Manila.

The names of three more Oregon boys appear on the latest official list of dead from Manila, which was received at Washington on the 11th. They are Fred J. Norton, of Snohomish, Wash., of company F, dysentery; Frank M. Hibbs, of McMinnville, company A, dysentery; Harry G. Hibbard, of Willard, company K, typhoid fever.

Raised Warships.

Manila, Dec. 12.—The Isle de Cuba, one of the ships sunk by Dewey in the battle of Manila, and which he subsequently caused to be raised, started for Hong Kong today under her own steam. She is of 1030 tons displacement and 2200 indicated horse-power.

Explosion Kills Five and Entombs Twenty-Three men.

Porteau, I. T., Dec. 13.—A few minutes after 9 o'clock last night in mine No. 2, of the Indianola & Rathway Coal Company, three miles from this place, a terrific explosion took place. Five men are known to have lost their lives from its immediate effects, and 23 more are imprisoned in the shaft.

The explosion was caused by the ignition of coal dust after a blast had been fired. Over 100 men were at work in the mine at the time of the explosion, and only about one-half of these have been accounted for. There seems to be little hope of rescuing the entombed miners. A hundred men are working valiantly to rescue their comrades.

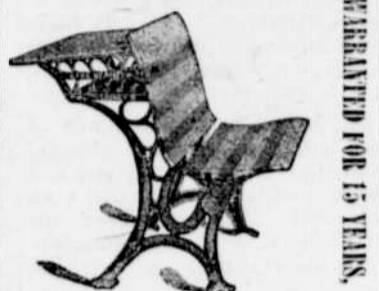
