More anon. CECEL FIELD. REVOLUTION IN SAMOA. Heavy Fighting Between the Forces of Mataafa and Those of Malietoa—Decision of Chief Justice Chambers Caused It.

San Francisco, Jan. 18.—A cablegram to the Call from Auckland, New Zealand, under date of January 17, says:

"When the steamship Alameda left Apia, January 17, a revolution had broken out on the Samoan Islands and was being waged with much bloodshed and great destruction of property."

On December 31 Chief Justice Chambers decided in favor of Malietoa Tanu, claiming Mataafa was barred by the treaty of Berlin, January 1. Five thousand of Mataafa's followers rose in rebellion and defeated 2000 of Malietoa's forces, ambushing them, killing 13 natives and wounding many.

The rebels have burned 400 houses and razed towns on Upolu. Several hundred Samoan foreigners are unharmed.
