The Latest Compiled Resources of Coos County, Oregon.

LUMBERING. Lumber is one of the principal exports of Coos county, and Coos bay is the principal manufacturing center.

Table with 2 columns: Resource, Value. Includes lumber, laths, broomhandles, pickets.

SHIP BUILDING. The following vessels were built during 1897: At North Bend Mill, Coos Bay—Barkentine "Encore," value, \$30,000; schooner "Repeat," value, \$20,000.

FLOURING. The principal flouring mill, roller system, was destroyed by fire in 1897. There is one waterpower burr-mill and one chopping mill, situate on the Coquille river.

OTHER MANUFACTURING. The other manufacturing interests of Coos county are 1 woolen mill, 1 stove and box mill, 2 broomhandle mills, 2 shingle mills, 1 tannery, 1 tub mill and 1 box mill.

FISHERIES. There are 2 salmon canneries on Coos bay and 2 on the Coquille river; only one of these was operated in 1897.

MINES, MINERALS AND STONE. Four hundred and fifty square miles of Coos county's area is underlain with a superior quality of lignite coal.

TIMBER. Ten billion feet is the estimate of the merchantable timber in Coos county. The timber growth consists of fir (Oregon pine), 3 species—red, yellow and white; red and white cedar, spruce, hemlock, yew, myrtle, maple, ash, white and live oak, alder, dogwood, madrone, chittim and numerous smaller growths, principally crabapple and willow.

WATER POWER. The waterpower in Coos county is undeveloped. The tributaries of the Coquille and Coos rivers have many natural sites for water power.

TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES. During the year 1897 there were 6 steamers and 15 sailing vessels making regular trips to Coos bay from San Francisco and 2 steamers running regularly in the San Francisco-Portland and Coos bay trade.
