Persuant to call by D. S. Holton, captain of Camp No. 11, the Indian war veterans of the North Pacific coast met in city hall at Grants Pass on January 7th, A. D. 1899.

The Indian war veterans of the North Pacific coast, would earnestly and respectfully ask that the bill now pending in the house of representatives and twice passed by the senate, providing pensions for Indian war veterans, pass and become a law.

Whereas, That now many of the old Indian war veterans have spoliation or deprivation claims pending in congress or sleeping in or before the court of claims, anything you may do to hasten or facilitate action on these claims will be thankfully received by the few remaining old pioneers of Oregon.

Whereas, We are all now old, decrepit and many of us in need and pecuniary want as we are fast passing away, and in a few more years there will be nothing left to mark the graves of the hardy pioneers who fought their way through bands of uncivilized savages to this coast and were engaged in almost a continuous Indian warfare for 10 years, from 1847 to 1857, before we brought the Indians under subjection and control on reservations, so that it was possible for people to live in peace and enjoy their homes and firesides and the women and children be safe from the scalping knives of the wily savages.

Whereas, Are we to receive any reward of merit for the hardships, privations and dangers we have gone through to gain and maintain peace and liberty on this coast, or shall we go down to oblivion, without even a stake driven in the ground to mark the resting place of the hardy pioneers who paved the way for the advancing steps of civilization at the present day and built as it were a city by the sea?

Whereas, Had it not been for us in those pioneer days of more than 50 years ago, the Northwest territory, as it was those days termed, would today still be a howling wilderness inhabited only by savages and wild beasts. We would therefore respectfully ask that the bill pass for the benefit of the few who are now living, and the memory of the dead.
