Death of A. J. M. Campbell.

A. J. M. Campbell died this morning at the home of his son, Capt. Cliff Campbell, South Marshfield, after a lingering illness. Mr. Campbell was born in New York city in June, 1815. He was a machinist by trade, and conducted a business in Brooklyn for 25 years. He came to San Francisco in 1868 and the following year came to Coos bay, where he has since resided. Since coming here, he has been principally engaged in the steamboat business. He built the steamers Juno, Comet and Fawn; was owner of the Mink, and part owner of the steamer Coos. Mr. Campbell was the father of seven children, five of whom are living—George and Cliff, Marshfield; Mary Frances Van Houten, New Jersey; Lenora Campbell, Marshfield; Albert P., Azaos, Cal. His oldest son, Albert B. Campbell, was acting chief engineer on the Monitor in her famous battle with the Merrimac. Mr. Campbell was well known to the old residents of this section, and bore the reputation of an honorable, straightforward man, thoroughly reliable in all business dealings, and was highly esteemed by a large circle of friends and acquaintances.—Coos Bay News.

DEATH OF MRS. J. M. DAVIS.
Coos Bay News: The funeral of Mrs. J. M. Davis, of Coos river, took place at Marshfield on Sunday. Services were conducted at the residence of W. B. Curtis, South Marshfield, by Rev. W. Horsfall, after which the remains, followed by a large concourse of mourning relatives and friends, were taken to the Odd Fellows' cemetery for interment. Mrs. Davis' maiden name was Mary Ann Brown. She was born in Lancashire, England, Sept. 16, 1827, and was 71 years, 4 months and 25 days old at the time of her death. She came to the United States when 24 years old, and was shortly afterward married to Wm. Hirst. After living in Ohio five years, she moved to California, and about 40 years ago came to Oregon. By her first husband she had five children—Mrs. Emma Nasburg, Marshfield; John W. Hirst, Santa Clara, Cal.; Mrs. Rose Curtis, Marshfield; Mrs. M. Cordy, San Francisco; Mrs. Alice Richardson, Walnut Creek, Cal. In February, 1865, she was married to J. M. Davis, of Coos river, and one son was born—J. B. Davis. Her death was caused from exhaustion after a gripe.
