Celebration in the Philippines.

Manila, July 4.—There was a great celebration of the Fourth of July here, with fireworks, bands, speeches and decorations everywhere, all nationalities participating. The foreign ships and consulates, including the Spanish, raised their colors in conjunction with the Stars and Stripes. The flagship Baltimore fired a national salute at noon. All nationalities enjoyed what the Spanish papers termed the "festa of North America."

The newsboys shouted Fourth of July editions, and soldiers paraded the town, throwing firecrackers from the batteries on the water front. In the afternoon the Luneta was crowded with Americans, Filipinos and Spaniards. Thousands of pedestrians and hundreds of carriages went there for the concert, directed by Bandmaster Carl Erndt, of the Sixth artillery band, and hundreds of Filipinos played American tunes. Several hundred boys and girls, Filipinos, Spaniards and Chieseas, from the public schools, each carrying an American flag, sang "America," in a curious mixture of dialects.

Toasts of Five Nations.

Five prominent gentlemen of foreign birth chanced to meet in Los Angeles; one a Russian, one an American, one a Frenchman, one a Turk and another an Englishman. The gentlemen became bosom friends, and finally a champagne supper was proposed. Each was to give a toast to his native country, the one giving the best toast being at no expense for the wine. Here are the toasts given:

Russian—Here's to the Bars of Russia that never were pulled down. Turk—Here's to the Moon of Turkey, whose wings were never clipped. Frenchman—Here's to the Cock of France, whose feathers were never picked.

American—Here's to the Stars and Stripes of the United States of America, that have never been trailed in defeat. Englishman—Here's to the rompin', roarin' lion of Great Britain, that tore down the bars of Russia, clipped the wings of Turkey, picked the feathers of France, and ran like 'ell from the Stars and Stripes of the United States of America.—Ex.

Machinery arrived at Empire the fore part of the week for the Parkersburg mill. It is the intention to have the tug Triumph go to the bay after the machinery next Sunday.

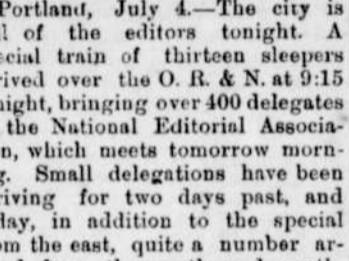
