## Coos Bay News.

Coos Bay News: If the people of Coos Bay want the jetty completed, immediate action is necessary. We understand that the engineers were under the impression that the last appropriation was sufficient to finish the North jetty, and consequently in their report Coos Bay was omitted. It is now apparent that the appropriation was insufficient and the work will be left in an incomplete state, unless an additional appropriation can be secured. The Chamber of Commerce should act in the matter at once, and represent the condition of affairs to the authorities, so that Coos Bay would not be omitted from the River & Harbor Bill, which, as the case stands at present, is highly probable. No time is to be lost; prompt action is absolutely necessary.

## Roseburg Review.

Rev. W. S. Holt, of Portland, lectured at the Presbyterian church in Roseburg last night on the recent anti-foreign uprising in China. Mr. Holt was for twelve years a missionary in that country and showed the principal cause was the continued aggressions of the European nations. One harbor after another has been seized by foreign powers until China has not one left into which she can bring her own warships without the consent of some other nation. These things have aroused a very strong anti-foreign sentiment, the Chinese believing themselves to be the central and most enlightened power of the world, the other nations being merely outside and in some sense dependent states occupied by barbarians and "foreign devils". The penetration of these outsiders into the interior brought about the crisis known as the Boxer uprising. The Boxers are a powerful secret organization formed to oppose the imperial government, but by the diplomacy of the empire they were led to believe all their troubles were brought about by the white "foreign devils" and thus formed all their forces against the common enemy.
