Ordered that the petition for the aid of Lucy Jackson be granted and that she be paid \$5.00 per month from Jan. 1st, 1901, until further orders of this Court.  
That the monthly allowance for Mrs Marshall of \$12.00 be discontinued.  
That Mrs Mary Steel be allowed \$5.00 per month from the indigent soldiers fund.  
Ordered that J T McCormac be awarded the contract of keeping the indigent sick other than those at the infirmary for the term of three years at the rate of \$2.50 per day each.  
Ordered that W Culin, be awarded the contract of furnishing the patients of the County Infirmary with medical attention at the rate of \$4.00 per visit for the term of one year.

ROAD MATTERS.  
That the relocation of a portion of the Coos Bay Wagon Road through the lands of John Weaver, near Sumner, be granted, and Chas

Collier, J A Collier and W W Gage be appointed viewers, and S B Cathcart, surveyor, to meet Jan. 15th; said petitioner to pay all expenses for the relocation.

Ordered that the following streets and lots in Elvy's addition to the Town of Riverton be vacated, namely: All of blocks one and two, and that part of streets numbered one, two and three lying south of the south boundary line of what is now "A" street. And also all the streets designated as "B" and "C" streets, and also all that part of "D" street lying and being west of the west boundary line of what is now First street, and that said streets cease to be of public use for easements or otherwise.
