Commissioner Bailey Pleased.

State Food Commissioner Bailey is well pleased with the result of legislative work during the recent session. He thinks Oregon's pure food laws are now as comprehensive as those of any state of the Union.

"The new law relating to oleomargarine," he said, "forbids the coloring of that article in any way, and empowers the Food Commissioner to seize the stuff wherever found."

"As regards cheese, the consumers are protected by the clause compelling the manufacturer to label his product 'full cream,' 'one-quarter-skimmed,' or 'half-skimmed,' as the case may be, so that people will know just what kind of cheese they are buying."

"Milkmen in cities of 50,000 population and over are required to report the location of their dairies to the Food Commissioner in order that he may visit them and see that they are in good sanitary condition."

Oregonian: One of the oldest industrial plants in England, the Brightside works, of Sheffield, is coming to America to establish extensive steel works where they can enjoy the benefits of protection, cheap fuel and cheap iron.

The Press as a Mirror.

Some of the more sensational, or "yellow," newspapers are quoting with great glee a reported defense of their methods by Dr. Lynn Abbott. This distinguished clergyman, it is asserted, said to those who criticize the newspaper for recording so much of the evil in the world that the fault is not with the newspapers that report, but the civilization that permits so much wrong.

"If you look in your glass and see a dirty face," says Dr. Abbott, "you don't wash the mirror." The phrase is a good one, the illustration apt, but it is far too sweeping as a comment on the relations of journalism to the world to stand alone.

That is exactly what newspapers of a certain sort do. The good things in the world are ignored or thrust into an obscure corner—the evil of the world is magnified and exploited. They do not hold the mirror up to nature, but reflect humanity chiefly in its baser and least creditable moods.

All Oregon butter is now required to be marked with wrappers as follows "Oregon Creamery Butter, 32 ounces, Full Weight," or "16 ounces," should the brick contain but a pound. This applies not only to Oregon stock, but all outside butter sold in this market must also contain full weight, or if not the dealer must notify his customer should the roll be short of the required weight.
