The following is a letter to which the recipient responded, taking Wednesday's train to catch the steamer at the bay. He will enlist for a period of two years: SOUTHSIDE LIFE SAVING STATION, SAN FRANCISCO, CAL., JUNE 20, 1901.

Wm. DOYLE, Parkersburg, Or. Your name having been certified to me as eligible for employment as a surfman in this section, I have to inform you of your selection as such, and to request that you report to the station without delay. If for any reason you do not wish to accept the employment, please notify me of that fact by return mail, in order that I may take other steps to fill the vacancy in the crew at this station.

On Wednesday last, about 10 a. m. we had a little reminder of our extreme necessity of a more efficient water supply for fire protection. A little blaze on the roof of the home of T. A. Walker called out the people who soon extinguished the flames, but this should serve as a warning. We need an organization of the best material our town affords, supplied with the best appliances for reaching the roofs of the houses and contending with fires that could be provided at present. Not even the small amount of water we now have can be advantageously hauled. Who will take the first steps in the direction of instituting a hook and ladder company to be ready to cope with the fiery fiend when occasion requires.

Albert Barklow, the road supervisor of the South Fork section, was in town Friday, and he informs us that he is getting the road in his district pretty well worked over. He has put in two or three months on the roads of his district, some of which were in a very bad condition. The Decent slide is now cleared away and the road is in good condition at that point. This slide occurred last winter and it was necessary to build a temporary trestle work around it till it could be removed. Mr. Barklow has 175 miles of road in his district, and he finds it quite a bit of work to put them in proper condition after the winter storms.

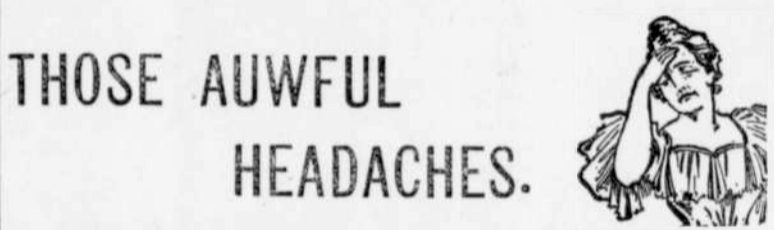
