Resolved, That in his death the Bar of this State has lost one of its ablest and most respected members, and the people of this community a highly honorable and beloved citizen. J. W. BENNETT'S ADDRESS.

In moving the adoption of the resolutions J. W. Bennett said: We are here at this time to show by our presence and words the love and respect which we bear for the memory of our departed member, the Hon. S. H. Hazard. Ever since 1872 he was a distinguished and honored member of the bar of this district, displaying qualifications, both professionally and socially, which made him very dear to all who knew him. Born of religious parents his youth was surrounded by the teachings of Christianity, and his marvellous instinct for intuitively selecting that which was right from that which was wrong undoubtedly had its foundation there. No one could be more zealous than he in weighing the facts of his clients cause with the law bearing thereon in the scales of equity before engaging in or advising litigation, but after being convinced of the righteousness of the undertaking no one could be more determined to succeed. Though enthusiastic in these undertakings he was nevertheless fair and reasonable at all times, and ever above anything which savored of questionable practice. Bounded up by the righteousness of his undertakings he was persistent in research, incessant in investigation, tenacious in perusal, and a formidable antagonist at the bar. Slow to conclude yet at times fluent in argument; sturdy in reasoning and at all times possessing unshrinking constancy and courage which characterized all his undertakings; and his place in the profession was such which can be pointed to with pride as an example for others to follow. Though liberal in his ideas he was incessant and tenacious in his efforts to stimulate and elevate common thought. He went among, and was known by, the entire community. He appealed to their reasoning powers for good. By his suggestions and example he taught mankind not to fear, but to know and control ones evil tendencies; to select legitimate recreation and rest from the impurities which encumber sport. Not to annihilate one because of the other, but by his presence and example to discourage the evils and enjoy what was legitimate and pure. Moving on broad lines of freedom of action and freedom of thought yet firmly commending all that was fair and elevating, but never fearing yet always discouraging evil for good. He abhorred every form of human oppression and like many men of this great country he was opposed to slavery, yet gloried in the teachings of Jefferson and his State rights doctrine. Ready at all times he was to give his time and best efforts to advance the interests of the community in which he labored, and he could always be relied on to give in public the thoughts which occurred to him in private to advance the many local organizations of which he was a respected member. He filled many places of public

trust both in the legislature and at the bar, and no one has ever been able to point to a single instance where he was even suspected of being untrue to those he represented. His many enviable qualifications made him a valuable requisition to society, and his genial disposition was both marked and attractive in social gatherings.
